Extended or heavy rainfall can cause damage to property and put human life in danger. Preventative measures will ensure that you have met your responsibilities if you have to submit a claim.



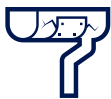
1. Drive slowly and carefully

- Check your tyre tread, wipers and brakes before driving in the rain.
- Avoid driving in downpours or pull over when it is safe to do so if you are caught in one.
- Avoid driving in downpours or pull over if you are caught in one.



2. Prepare for flash floods

- Stay informed through your local channels, social media platforms and other relevant forums.
- Do not drive through a flooded area in the road, turn around or move to higher ground.



3. Prepare your home for heavy rains

- Secure gutters and downpipes, and clear debris from gutters.
- Maintain your pipes, walls and roof when leaks appear to prevent collapse during heavy rain.
- Prune any branches that could fall during a storm.
- Have a lightning rod if you have a lot of trees or a thatched roof.



4. Submit your claims timeously

- Report claims as soon as possible.
- Provide complete details to your insurer as specified in your policy.



5. Keep a raincoat or umbrella handy

- Keep yourself, your wallet, your cellphone, and cards dry.
